Apostles, prophets, and teachers roamed from church community to church community, presenting the message that God's promise to Abraham to bless every nation of the world through him was being fulfilled in Jesus. This simple message was the mystery of God, a part of his eternal plan.

But it got more complicated as they started living it out in each other's presence. Some of these inspired people, like Peter at times and no doubt me if I had been there, let the traditions be greater than the message. They would refuse to eat with Gentiles, seeing them as something to be avoided, even after they had become their brothers and sisters through new birth. Jewish Christians equated faithfulness with embracing the traditions of the Old Law, and remember the Old Law was the only Bible they had at the time.

Many of the New Testament books, the ones we call "Epistles" were written to address the misunderstandings and bring people back to the simple message that salvation for all came through Jesus, only. There is a lot of "tradition addressing" going on in these books. Things we might see pretty clearly, like women's veils or holy kisses. But also some things we might not understand as clearly.

Where belonging to God means belonging to each other.

Let's be careful as we approach Scripture. There is a simple message; Jesus is the only hope of being with God. Then there is the more complicated "day to day" living stuff; like how we show respect to God or what to do when we've messed up.

It doesn't mean we can't do a good job at it, but untangling from our traditions and just getting the message of God is more challenging. At least it was for Christians at the beginning, and they were a lot like us.

There is a strong temptation to think that everything in Scripture is either black or white. It simply isn't so. When Gentiles were ushered into a church composed of Jewish disciples, it exposed many assumptions made by people in both groups.

The Jewish Christians assumed that the time honored commands of circumcision, kosher foods, Sabbath keeping, and religious feasts would continue just as they always had. Everyone in their circle was comfortable with these things, had practiced them for a lifetime, and it had become a part of the fabric of their lives.

Enter the Gentiles (that's us by the way) and they brought their own understandings of God/gods. They were accustomed to their gods playing tricks on them, engaging in deceit, and needing to be appeased. They paid for a god's favor with every purchase in the marketplace, or event in day to day life. As a result of this, their worlds collided dramatically when it came to "church life". The Jews had their scrolls with the words that God had inspired from their history. It was something that they could refer to that was authoritative and spoke clearly to issues of life. For the first twenty or so years of the life of the early church, this was the entirety of the recorded words of God.
