See, hopelessness is contagious. It feeds on itself. Soon, as the conversations shift to these topics and we start talking about "New World Orders", or the crash of the global economy no one is thinking about what God might be doing. It is as though we believe that the world is truly in the hands of politicians, big money people, and terrorist groups.

I don't have a single fear that some group is going to start a war that is the final battle on earth before we blow it into tiny pieces. From what I can read in Scripture, the end of the world comes exactly on the day God determines it will and not a day before that.

When I truly believe that God is in control of the future, all of the extremes move aside. I am not saying you can't plan for old age, but I do contend you don't need to go bury a shipping container in the woods and learn which weeds are edible.

Does this mean that the economy can't collapse? Of course it can. Does it mean that there will never be another war, not at all. What I am suggesting is that you and I are much better served to spend our time and energies on speaking of our confidence in God than our fears for America. I believe our world needs the message of hope in Scripture more than it needs camo clothing and racks of AK47s.
