

Church life has had vogue approaches to getting things done as well. At one time, “all growing churches have to have a bus ministry.” Or, the issue of the day was the “immodesty of women wearing pant suits,” or “men who wear their hair over their ears”. These “issues” have bounced around over the years, distracting us from the task and making us at best foolish and at worst ineffective.

First century churches faced the same things. Paul warned the church in Colossae, “¹⁶ Therefore, don’t let anyone judge you in regard to food and drink or in the matter of a festival or a new moon or a Sabbath day. ¹⁷ These are a shadow of what was to come; the substance is the Messiah. (Colossians 2:16-17) We see there has always been an effort at external regulation to accomplish internal change. There was a shift from the substance (Jesus) to regulation (food/festivals). We can shift from our message, that Jesus offers the only access to God to procedures... how we do worship, or what we have to wear, or where someone has to sit, stand or whatever.

When we move from people coming to God to a focus of people making rules for each other... we are off task.

Trying to regulate each other is just as effective as foam bats. It doesn’t mean that godliness is unimportant, any more than it meant that controlling anger was unimportant. It is the manner we go about to control it. External regulation does not produce internal transformation. In the 2000 plus years that Christianity has been practiced, it never has.

This is a time of the year for “professional development” for me. That means I attend some ongoing education. Like most professional associations that issue licenses or certifications, my license as a marriage and family therapist requires that I attend a certain number of hours of training each year to maintain the license. There are hours in ethics, assessment, diagnosis and treatment that are required of those who the state of Kansas regulates.

In the middle of March, I attend the Tulsa Workshop for the same reason. No, there is no license to be a minister. Kansas doesn’t regulate who can preach where and on what topics. But the responsibility to maintain exposure to thoughts outside of my own study or particular area of interest is just as important.

Since I began practice as a therapist in the 1980s there are over 200 styles of therapy. A popular one at the time was using foam bats to “whack chairs” to defuse aggression and control anger. In the therapy supply magazines of the day, alongside the clinical journals were these foam bats for sale. Over time research demonstrated that “what you practice you do more, get better at”, so practicing anger was deemed counterproductive. Shocking, eh?
