rough ropes, tight enough that there would be no escape when the time came. Moving to the feet, practiced hands held the legs as he gathered his mallet and the spike. The crowd's jeering hushed as they held their breath for the first blow of the mallet, driving the spike into place to pin the feet to the upright. Then the roar and the screams mingled together as the crowd cheered and the condemned wailed.

Each blow of the hammer was felt by all there, for some a hideous hurt, for others a momentous victory.

But for him, just a job. The sweat from his brow dripping on the quivering flesh beneath him as he nailed Jesus at both hands and feet. Just a job.

As I think back at the events of that day, I don't want to be this man in history. The executioner, the hammer man who nails a body to the cross with blow after blow of an oversized mallet. Simply doing his job, carrying out the orders from above. It will be later, after the upright is hoisted into the slot and dropped into place, after he nails the plaque above him, "King of the Jews"... after these things, in the coming days he will learn.

But that day, he is doing his job. That day, he is just repeating the task that he does week after week in his work in this executioner's squad of soldiers. Three different men this day. Some days more, some days less, but just a job.

This day, however is different. This day remains seared into the mind. You see this day as he nailed Jesus to the cross, the very man who drove the nails received the same forgiveness as you and I. I wouldn't want to be that man, anonymous in Scripture. But in a sense I was.

It looked to be one of those kind, he thought as he watched the crowd milling their way to the top. There he was, the condemned, struggling to drag the beam amid the jeers, taunts and raucous laughter. Then he tripped, actually more he collapsed, his body almost to the breaking point it seemed. Some poor sap from the onlookers pressed into service to take over dragging the beam as the condemned was lifted, shoved and kicked along his way.

An odd mixture of folks, to his practiced eye. Evidently Jews from the dress of many in the crowd, and possibly some political implication, because he noticed some of the Jewish higherups keeping track of the process.

Here he is now. The beam was quickly jointed together and his practiced hand began the process of nailing it to the suspension pole. Each blow of the mallet caused a quivering of the hardened muscles in his weathered arm, as he drove spikes into the cross member. He noticed the jarring, visceral reaction in the body of the condemned. He might be broken and bloodied, but he knew what was coming.

He took his place on the right side of the cross beam, quickly lashing the hand tightly as the condemned's arm was held in place. Moving to the left side he continued to bind the arm with
