parking area and the sidewalks, I like to think of them contributing to the health of the Fleming Oak for the past hundred years.

Today, we celebrate Mother's Day. For those of you who have your mother, enjoy her today. Let her know of her importance. For many of us, like the Fleming Oak, our ancestors are gone. Only their roots remain to nourish us. We may be weathered, battered, experience drought, or oppressive heat, but deep beneath us we draw on those who have gone before. That needed strength, the ability to laugh, endure, persevere comes from past generations. So we draw from deep beneath us and continue to live.

I have no idea how many hundred years old the Fleming Oak is. Uncle Mart hid behind the big old tree in 1861. The tree that produced the seed that allowed this tree to grow might have started life two centuries before that. A tree lost to history, but living through another tree today.

You are establishing your roots today. They intertwine with the roots of those who gave you life. Perhaps your mother or grandmother are living. But living or gone, you draw from them, and those before them. Not only in this country, but the root system reaches across continents, oceans, and time. Those who never dreamed of what you are seeing combine to give you life.

The more important thing is that you are creating a system for those who follow you. So go deep to good water, spread wide for rich nourishment and seek the important things. Make sure rich, deep faith is the center of the taproot so you may feed those who are to come.
