The message of the Cross is really this, the message that Jesus has returned to heaven victorious.

Listen to Paul in Philippians:

- ⁸ He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death— even to death on a cross.
- ⁹ For this reason God highly exalted Him and gave Him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee will bow— of those who are in heaven and on earth and under the earth— ¹¹ and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

He has been shown to the world and now reigns from heaven over all creation. The message of Scripture is that Jesus is victorious, the battle is no longer in doubt. Paul spends little time on the crucifixion in this passage but focuses on the message that Jesus is highly exalted.

Our message is good news, that that Jesus died, that is only a small point in the story. The message is that God has granted him victory, highly exalting him, granting him a name that is above all others, so that we all confess him as Lord.

Where belonging to God means belonging to each other.

Don't miss the focal point.

I was asked recently how I summed up the message of the Cross. It didn't take long, the message of the Cross is that it is over. The paradox of the Cross is that Satan, the Jewish elite, and the Romans hoped that they were putting an end to the uprising of an upstart Jewish rabbi. In reality, the truth of the matter was they were fanning the flames and fueling the fires of a movement that exploded just a few days later in a resurrection.

The Cross points past the death to a resurrected Christ, exalted in the heavens. We look to a leader now who is seated at the right hand of God, beyond the struggle, victorious.

The first sermon on Pentecost records the history of Jesus. God worked with this descendant of David in performing unquestionable miracles, wonders and signs right in their presence. The crucifixion that they initiated in their rejection and the Romans completed was unsuccessful. God would not, never intended, to allow him to rot in the ground. Instead, it was the purpose of God to turn the darkness of the hour into the paramount moment in all of creation.
