I don't believe America is a Christian nation, because I believe Christianity is a decision made one person at a time. I don't wrap any flag around my beliefs, the "Stars and Bars" of the old south, nor "Old Glory". I don't believe that WWI, WWII, or any other conflict had God on one side or the other. No political party, form of government, or national agenda represents God.

So, like Christians at the inception of Christianity described in the New Testament, some things we "render to Caesar" and some things we "render to God". The government exists to "punish the evil doer", and we can pay our taxes, exercise our "appeals to Caesar", and function under it. But never believe that the purpose of government is to determine "right from wrong". Democracies, republics, monarchies, socialism, communism, and every other system of politics, is a flawed system driven by flawed people. God may use them, discard them, all to his own end... but they never define God.

Peter called Christians of his day "strangers and aliens". They lived in the world, but were not part of the world. James mentioned our "citizenship is in heaven, from which we await a Savior".

The best we can hope for is to lead a "quiet life"; we can do that under any system. We can do it if the courts support what we understand to be moral and righteous. We can do it in the face of the Colosseum and martyrdom. The system doesn't define right and wrong, God does that. Our task is to love God and love each other, when we agree with the powers that be and when we don't.

One caution, however. In our disagreement, we are not authorized by God to be hateful, mean, ugly or unkind... ever. We are to be the aroma of Christ and that requires us to treat every being made in the image of God with honor and respect, loving them exactly as God loves them.

It is an exciting time to be God's child... we are beginning to stick out.

Some were shocked by things happening within our culture this past month. Confirmation of a changing culture embracing different values than the "old guard" was evidenced in the conversations and decisions coming from governing officials. Facebook, Twitter and other social media venues, a method of glimpsing into the culture, were alive with discussions of right and wrong. I've kept my head low.

That the Supreme Court made a landmark decision about who may marry, in essence giving approval to same sex couples constituting a marriage, was shocking to a great many. In fact, a cursory reading of news reports, entertainment, or social media would demonstrate a changing standard within our country over the past 25 years. Then we also had the statements made by elected officials concerning flags flying over state houses. A century and a half after the Civil War, a banner that for some represents oppression and slavery, while to others it represents a regional pride or self-determination, is being removed. Walmart, National Parks, and others are all joining in on the choices.

As God's child, you no doubt have your views on the meaning and validity of these things. We may agree or disagree about some particulars, but I was forced to look at a larger issue this month. How does a Christian effectively live in a culture that is running counter to their understanding of the will of God?
