kept serving others. He cried and lamented over the city of David, reflecting on how many efforts had been made to turn her heart to God, then quietly died for her.

If you spend any time at all reading Scripture you will notice that people around Jesus do evil, he does good. His habit is to endure, yield and commit himself to God.

Some might say, "Easy for Jesus, he knew he was about to go back to heaven and become king of kings. He knew that it was only for a little while then he would be crowned with glory."

My answer is, "Exactly." Jesus didn't live with his eyes focused on this world. He knew his kingdom was not of this world. He understood that some infractions are not resolved until after Judgment Day. He knew his home was in heaven, not in this world. He lived a life very different from many contemporary Christians, because he was focused on something very different.

But don't forget... we are going to heaven as well. We are to be crowned with glory also. We, too, only have to put up with this in this life. The real world, the world that counts... it comes after this one. No, life isn't fair. No, life isn't avoiding the extremes. It comes at you and with ferocity. It is overwhelming. The challenges sometimes take our breath away. But, only for a little while.

For this reason, children of God have faced the deaths in the Colosseum, beheadings, expulsion, being ostracized... all because they knew this world is not the final answer. We can face the same kinds of situations with the same kinds of resolve.

Where belonging to God means belonging to each other.

Not only can we, we must. It is the only course for one who would follow the example of Jesus, even in a contemporary culture.
