When you are a person who lives by the code of returning a blessing for a curse (1 Peter 3:9), that is different than the impatience of using a middle finger at the driver who cuts you off in town. Making every humanly effort possible to live at peace with all men (Romans 12:18) is far different than making sure others treat you just right.

Paul told Titus, when the grace of God appeared to all men (when Jesus showed up), we were taught to live with some sense, being righteous, and exhibiting godliness right in the middle of this mess. (Titus 2:11-13) That is a far cry from raucous and unruly conduct that is sometimes exhibited by our contemporaries.

One of the most powerful things that comes across in Scripture as we read the life of Jesus is his profound kindness. The word compassion is used in conjunction with the life of Jesus more than any other word I can think of. He lived with a tender and sensitive heart, reaching out to and supporting all he came in contact with. Never underestimate the power of kindness.

Albert Schweitzer said, Constant kindness can accomplish much. As the sun makes ice melt, kindness causes misunderstanding, mistrust, and hostility to evaporate. It is a focused, conscious act of will to be kind. Few of us, I would hazard to guess, have ever been in the presence of consistent and focused kindness. When you are, and you recognize it... the world changes. It did with the presence of Jesus, and we are called to that same high calling.

Where belonging to God means belonging to each other.

Remember, you don't treat others kindly because they are kind. You do it because you are kind. When you adopt such a standard, you change the world.
