

transformation, the Scriptures refer to it as sanctification. We see it in the lives of those who walked with Jesus. A group of rough and tumble fisherman and tradesmen become a passionate unified group who alter the path of civilization. They didn't do it because Jesus taught this one singular idea that transformed their way of thinking. They became something else because of the relationship that opened the opportunity for change.

If you read the story of the Gospels and pay special attention to Peter, you would never suspicion that he is the author of the books of 1 and 2 Peter. The sword bearer in the garden becomes the advocate of an "inner self, the unfading beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is of great worth in God's sight" who are called to "Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the Emperor."

The change in the "sons of thunder" into the "disciple whom Jesus loved" takes place when truth is experienced in a relationship, not some public debate hall.

It takes time connected to others to slowly peel back the emotional guardedness and allow new information to soak in. It is less the singular statement of brilliance and more the persistence of presence that alters the protective defenses we erect around us.

The world did not change by the stately Star of Bethlehem, but by the teacher who walked among us embodying grace and truth. It was his relationship with them that caused them to recognize, "Where else would we go, you alone have the words of life?"

So when you are challenged then question if you should stay, don't give up on them, embrace the child once more and do it again. Learn to smile in frustration, persevere through sluggishness, and to realign when things get off track. It isn't a sprint to the end, it is a lifestyle. Remember, God has been calling us his children and working on this old world a long time.
