them from the consequences of sin until Jesus paid the full price of the sins. Then the animal sacrifices become reminders that sin has consequences, but also that God is protecting them from the results of their sin.

Which view moves us closer to God? Which view helps us understand God's desire for us? Turning then to the New Testament and seeing Jesus arrive, his message stood in stark contrast to what had been preached.

The religious orthodoxy of the day had convinced themselves and those around them that God didn't really like them too much. Now they taught God liked Jews far more than Gentiles, but most of the Jews he didn't like too much. So, to keep in God's favor and to avoid his wrath, there were lots of regulations to observe. Keep the Sabbath, no matter what it cost you. Maintaining an external isolation from the "unclean" was of far more value than any good that you might do for them. In fact, a careful reading of the regulations might result in not having to really do God's intent completely.

Where belonging to God means belonging to each other.

Many lived in hopelessness, because they didn't hear messages of hope. They were clear about their guilt, because it was re-enforced each day, but not about God's desire for them. When Jesus showed up with a different message, in the words he spoke and the way he lived, the hopeless flocked to him.

Maybe, when you feel hopeless... you should read it again.

How we understand God, if from an informed position of Scripture or an uninformed position of human/church tradition, will either limit or enhance our movement toward him.

There are those who view God as a threat to be bought off. Perhaps when reading the Old Testament, they reached the view from the thousands upon thousands of animal sacrifices, that this indicates that "God is going to get you" unless you pay him off. Just as Molech (god with a head of a calf and hollow arms of brass filled with coals so they would glow) required children to be placed in his arms to insure prosperity and avoid calamity in the future, one might assume animal sacrifices for sins were for the same purpose.

Each year the Day of Atonement reminded Israel again that God had withheld his justice to a guilty people who offered more sacrifices for sin. Of course that same idea can be see through a different lens. It was also a reminder that God had extended mercy, shielding
