need to deal with life. I have learned that the reason we pray is to ask God, through his son, to be with us when the tough times come, not to take the tough times away. I have learned to cling to Him and the cross in my most demanding moments and that will get me through.

While we live in a culture that seeks escape from so many things, this man has learned that "presence is more powerful". Awareness of God being with him is what sustains him in the worst of it all. It isn't that prayer can't be for deliverance, but when that is all prayer is...that says something about us as well.

As I monitor my prayers, I've noticed that I ebb and flow with this focus. While not necessarily focused on myself, it is easy for me to spend more time asking God to "fix something, than to ask God to be present in something".

Where belonging to God means belonging to each other.

Talking to those who surround family members with Alzheimer's, it is easy to just want it to be like it used to be. I spoke with two terminal cancer patient families by phone this week. As we talked about the focus of prayers, they still hoped for a miracle that might reset the clock. Learning to see the places that God was present was difficult in the face of such loss. Let me urge you this week, think about your praying. Listen to your pleadings before God. Do you seek his presence or only his "prizes"?
