Let me give you this caution, before our language becomes too enflamed. Whatever your natural response is to the presence of evil, it is usually wrong. "He hit me first", "she did this to me", "that was mine", and "we had it first" are all rationalizations children use to justify their own unjust behavior. It is natural to hit little brother when he pokes you in the ear, natural but wrong.

Wait, you say. If you take this approach, we will lose. Ah, so that is the goal, to win? Let me remind you about the trajectory of Christianity. That is a cross you are carrying. Why do you have it? Simply a reminder that Jesus had one? Or doesn't Jesus' saying, "No one can follow unless he deny himself, take up his cross daily and follow me...." Mean anything? You see the end of our road may well be death. When you've always been on the winning side you tend to forget that.

That dragging a cross behind you is a reminder that we don't get out of this alive. We present a message of Jesus to a lost world because it is better. Not because the world will be a better place, but because we are going to be saved from this world.

Terroristic activity in Paris resulted in 129 deaths, the day before 43 were killed in Beirut, while in Kenya 147 died with attacks on Garissa University. In July over 100 were killed in attacks in Egypt and also last month over 100 were killed in Turkey by bombing. We live in a fallen world.

Josephus records that the Romans crucified thousands. Ivan the terrible is reported to have killed 60,000. It isn't difficult for us find ample historical support for the case of this world having a pervasive amount of evil. How do we do it?

First pray. If you don't believe that prayer matters during a time of crisis, you suffer under the illusion that you can control the outcome. We do not have the ability, apart from God, to stand against the forces of the evil one. John states, "Greater is he that is in you, than he who is in the world." We move to prayer
