move forward in my tasks. I ask the Spirit to soften me, to make me aware of my resistance to him and to help me to be more open to his direction in both the Word of God and the opportunities that he presents to me.

If it would it easier for you to speak with God by using more common language, by all means do so. Private prayer does not sound like public prayers. You don't need to limit yourself to "styles", cadence or language set. The point is to connect to a relationship with a God who loves you as his own child.

Simplicity, openness, honesty, and sincerity are the key ingredients.

It certainly doesn't have to sound like the character in the cartoon below.

I pray for long periods of time, multiple hours at a time most days. For me, the longer I focus into my prayers, the more meaningful and powerful they are to my spiritual life. This is not to say that short pointed prayers about an immediate concern are shallow or unimportant, but for me, I tend to need time to focus and meditate. My intent is not to be critical of anyone else's prayer but I read this little cartoon, and it seems to capture one reason that it is difficult for some to develop the habit of prayer, based on listening to others praying.

It is very common for folks to use certain styles or language in prayer. It seems to arise from an effort to be respectful and reverent. The use of "King James" English with the "Thee's" and "Thou's" is one of these efforts. Others develop a cadence or rhythm to their prayers. Moving in melodic tones, with a sing song effect. I know that I tend to be habitual in addressing the Father in my public prayers, concluding asking for the return of Jesus.

In my private prayers I sometimes address Jesus directly or ask the Holy Spirit to assist me in communicating my words and meanings.
