What are the reactions that I see take place around me? Am I attempting to include others into the conversations? Do I notice those on the fringe, looking for the opportunity to be included?

What does this have to do with some point of spiritual teaching? Why write about this, Carl, it isn't a forum to just write about daily events? You are correct.

Groups are where we practice the "one another" passages of Scripture. You know the ones, bear with one another, grieve with one another, rejoice with one another, love one another.... There are lots of them.

How do we do? How did you do?
