I see others have inflicted on me, you might be in for a fandango.

You see, grudges (the holding on to hurts inflicted by others) is ultimately a self-defeating behavior. Did you see the word "self" in there? Now the results of the "injury" shifts from what others have done to me, to what I have done with my feelings about it. If I harbor, carefully cultivating and rationalizing my own "victimization" in the incident, I prime my own emotions for an outburst.

When I am focused on myself and my own hurts, I stop looking are the impact of my harsh words or recklessness. I excuse myself by saying, "I can't help it" or "I just couldn't take it anymore." Our own lack of discipline in offering forgiveness, controlling our pain, and regulating our inner conflict spills out on others.

It is at this point that we have to take responsibility for our behavior. This isn't about what others have done to me, it is about what I've failed to do myself. Now it is up to me, my task to be aware of others and not just myself.

Where belonging to God means belonging to each other.

Jesus uttered words like, "Father forgive them, they don't know what they are doing." Oh, they knew they were killing Jesus, but they didn't see the "big picture".

As we move through life, we need to see the big picture. What is the source of quarrels and fights? The other person? No, James (3) tells us it is our own passions at war in us. Look inside and regulate yourself.

It isn't easy, but it is godly.

Earlier in Proverbs (14:16) the writer tells us "One who is wise is cautious and turns away from evil. but a fool is reckless and careless." There are choices about how we deal with things. We are to lead disciplined lives, not reckless, careless ones.

Now. I am the first to admit... I am better at this when everything is going my way. If the injury is slight, the offense unimportant, my magnanimity knows no bounds. If you cut in front of me in the lunch line, I will seldom resort to a fist fight. But, if I've been harboring a grudge, against some injustice
