developing an ear for the way Scripture is written can be a pretty difficult task.

This is one of the reasons that I am encouraging you to read the Gospel accounts of the life of Jesus with me this year. Trying to read a chapter per day isn't too difficult and it allows us to have background to hear the story of the life of Jesus with new ears.

When God decided to display himself in the most clear of all ways, it wasn't fire from the sky or even the power of the ocean. God simply walked the earth with everyday people and interacted with their lives. That single idea amazes me each time I think of it.

In the midst of political upheaval, Jesus walked along focused on God. In the middle of the hurts and the heartaches of the everyday man, Jesus stooped, knelt, and touched people where they lived. In the great times of wedding celebrations, or the grieving of those who faced the death of others, Jesus was present and caring for needs.

No fanfare, no fancy clothes or clever gimmicks, just God in human form reinterpreting misconceptions about man's real state and purpose. When Jesus taught about God, people heard the story as never before. When he described our necessary behavior, it was in clear and unequivocal terms.

No one left Jesus confused about how he loved them. No one left an experience with the Christ without benefiting from the encounter. Those from the Jewish ruling body or the disenfranchised poor felt him approachable. The ostracized lepers, the blind men, the cripples, and the mourning families could all expect his concern. It says volumes about God. You might want to re-read Mark's gospel.
