have to review in my mind each thing that we are planning to do, making sure it is safe for his skill level. But, as you can see from this concentration, he is trying to get it right. That is the important thing to me.

Also notice, making Jayce a disciple in the wood shop isn't a one man job. His parents have to make him available, trusting I will keep him safe. He works with his dad on woodworking things at his house. Grandma made his shop apron, so he feels a part of the task. Jayce, has the enthusiasm.

Let me tell you what making a disciple out of him isn't. We don't sit down with an endless list of things he can't do. We don't have a list of "if you don't do this you aren't a true disciple" things. We just do it, together. We go over things that work, and we talk about why we are doing things. We are partners in it. I am the leader, he follows, but both of us share in the task. When we try something that doesn't work, we talk about, back up and try again. We don't throw our hands up and say it is hopeless. We don't turn the workbench over and throw a hammer across the room. We just begin again. No name calling, no labeling, no ostracizing. You see, in woodworking unexpected things happen. Sometimes you sand a little deep, or the work piece is too brittle, or the finish runs. So, you try again. I don't know what kind of wood worker Jayce will be. He may really like it and do it all his life. He may only do it as a hobby, or when there is something that has to be done around the house. I have this vision of one day his being a Papa and teaching his grandson. It doesn't really matter how masterful he becomes at it. It is only woodworking. But I do know that I have a part in it, because it is a priority to me. I learn a lot about disciple making with Jayce. I hope it makes sense as I make disciples in other fields. I am pretty sure the principles are the same. Time, commitment, enthusiasm, and the willingness to tolerate some mistakes.
