But, it is meaningless to condemn an action in other people without offering a solution for improvement. To do this, I am called to stand beside the repugnant. I must do what is uncomfortable for me so that a different voice is heard, a new action is modeled, and a different way of being becomes the norm.

It isn't just about them, it is also about me. Unless I move beside them, I will never see life from their point of view. Imagine trying to give someone directions without knowing where they are. How do you get from where you are to where you are planning to go... well, where are you?

Those who are trying to be like Jesus have to brave the difficult side of life. Perhaps the seedy side, sometimes the awkward side, often the uncomfortable side. We have to be light in a dark world, extending a word of grace, kindness, and mercy where such things are unusual.

The frustration level will at times be consuming. Jesus, overlooking Jerusalem, cried over her... Jerusalem, Jerusalem. How many times have I longed to gather your children under my wings as a chicken gathers her chick, but you would not have it." He understood the frustration, pain and anguish of serving those who behaved in vulgar ways. Those who repudiated the help offered, and killed those who tried to caution them. He understood it all the way to the cross.

Where belonging to God means belonging to each other.

That is the other difficult thing. At times, this coming along side those who are challenging results in the disciple maker being sacrificed. The acts of kindness and grace are ignored, scoffed at, or discounted. But it is still our calling, as tough as it is.

In discussing ministry and the accompanying challenges with someone recently, I was asked what I considered the greatest challenge in working with people. That isn't difficult for me to answer, but I don't think I had ever articulated it out loud before.

One of the greatest challenges in my ministry is to come along side those who, through attitude or speech, are repugnant to me. For example, when a person uses vile language in describing others based on race or ethnicity. Or when someone is repetitively demeaning or uncaring about those who are marginalized in our community.

You see, when Jesus came into our world, those who the religious majority found disposable (the blind, lame, lepers, and the poor), became the ones that Jesus spent time with. Prostitutes, tax gatherers, and others with "history" were those he shared meals with on a regular basis. When John sent disciples, while he was in prison, to verify that Jesus was the Christ, Jesus gives proof by saying that the blind see, lepers are clean, and the poor have the good news preached to them. So, if such compassion was core to the nature of Jesus, it should be present in his followers.
