Thessalonica, saying if someone would not work they should not eat. Living with an "eye to the clouds" is a good thing, but it requires a balance. But, living with your mind consumed by things of the earth causes us to not be sensitive to the things of God.

But today the world is full of references to a resurrection. A message of hope to a world that is typically focused on tragedies like Brussels, 9/11, or the politics. I, for one, appreciate the break.

That the world can speak so casually about the resurrection is a mystery to me. Twitter, Facebook and all other social media is awash in references to Easter, empty tombs, and Jesus. Religious leaders of Christendom will be quoted today. Their messages and behaviors deemed as news worthy. Families will rise before daylight, dress and head for some location to watch the sunrise while worshiping God.

Tomorrow, things will return to the same old thing. We will read about some inconsistency in a politician's message. We will return to the drudgery of everyday life, and there won't be further mention of the resurrection. Next Sunday, many families who got up before daylight for Easter services will remember this is the only day they get to sleep in. This is the reality of life. But, today we get the chance to acknowledge something that is so incredibly special. Today we think about an eternity changing event. Today we reflect back on God's testimony to the world that those graves where we have shed so many tears will also one day be open. The hope moves beyond words.

Where belonging to God means belonging to each other.

Today, with a host of others, including the angels of heaven say, "He is risen."
