people like these old tools. They are battered, neglected, and sadly abandoned. They may see their time as having been in the past. It is a "young man's game" or "I'm past my prime" become the excuses for idleness. They still work, just differently, perhaps at a different pace. Some have had a more difficult life than others. Sometimes I wonder if people aren't like old tools.



Jesus spoke with lots of people who had been "left out in the rain too long." He knew that he was working with those who had been spiritually battered and bruised. He understood that they often saw themselves as without value or purpose anymore.

Where belonging to God means belonging to each other.

The religious leaders of his day questioned why he spent his time in the "broken tool bin." They didn't see the value in discarded parts and pieces. They walked past, or stepped over those who Jesus recognized as having value and potential

We live in a culture that casts away lots of folks. They regulate them to the "cull pile", rejected and unvalued. Jesus wouldn't have called them that. How do you see them?

I have a few projects I am working on, but there are times I am tinkering with the tools that are out there. I like old tools, but they require a bit of work to make them as functional as some of the newer things.

My drill press is a Montgomery Ward, PowrKraft. It is very heavily built and functions very well. I use it in both metal work and wood work. Back in 1953, when it was built, drill presses didn't come with large tables and a fence. For many of the projects that I do, I need a fence for repetitive, precise drilling. So, I reworked it.

Yesterday, while visiting with Janet's aunt Helen, she asked if I or my sons would be interested in an old brace and bit set that had belonged to Janet's grandfather. I brought it home, knowing there would be lots of work to bring it back to life.

The truth is, new cordless power drills have pretty well made a brace and bit set obsolete. They are "old school" tools. But, the batteries are never worn down. When used properly, the hole is drilled just as precisely, and accomplishes the task at hand. In our lives today, there are lots of
