made the move from junk to value with just a bit of attention from someone who noticed it.

Jesus showed us how to do that often in Scripture. Others often protested his spending time with the world's castoffs. But Jesus saw value where others saw nothing. He could see the difference between the carnage of what happens to someone and the value of the individual.

We may all be born in innocence, but we don't all start in the same place. Some return to a home of comfort, support, love, and joy. Some children are raised in homes of neglect, hopelessness, and emptiness. For some the answers provided for their circumstances are horribly wrong. Theft to offset need, deception to escape responsibility, and abuse rather than love. Some learn poor responses, without any light in the darkness of their world.

Years, decades, sometimes generations of poor responses create the rust, the scars, and the fractures that cause them to be discarded and eventually distained. There were poor choices, but sometimes there was no one who took the time to care and point to a different way.

Where belonging to God means belonging to each other.

Then Jesus spoke of God's love to those who prostituted themselves and called it survival. He offered grace to those who had never had a relationship that ended with success. He recognized the remorse and the value of a thief, who at the end of life saw his own responsibility, and spoke words of promise and hope.

I like to restore old tools, returning purpose after years of neglect and misuse. But I really like to talk with those who have no hope and speak of the love that God has for them. When God does that restoration, nothing surpasses it.
