Now I don't see myself as Paul, weighing decisions between life and death in Philippians 1. I don't think God grants me strength or recovery because you "need me". I believe, while different Christians are great supports and strengths to each other, that God can raise up many servants to do that role.

I do think the lesson of illness, weakness, frailty and discomfort is that this world is not where we belong. We are citizens of the kingdom of God, seeking a new heaven and a new earth. I long for the New Jerusalem, proceeding from the throne of God whose builder and maker is God.

There are many reasons to rejoice as we travel this world. Wheat harvest, for most of those in our area was better than expected. We've had some timely rain to refresh dryland crops that sorely needed it. We exist as a family of God in harmony and peace, rather than the fighting and backbiting that was characteristic of some 1st century churches. While a number of us this year have had to adjust our budgets, tightening things up, we still live in a culture of plenty and abundance.

Those are all good things, but don't be beguiled by these physical blessings, thinking this world is it. Lift up your eyes and see Jesus. He alone is the target. Everything else is just fluff.

Where belonging to God means belonging to each other.
