The effort to contact, to reach out, is not an attempt to eradicate the loss. There is not a way to undo the damage and the hurt. It is only a reminder that we don't move through crisis alone.

Feeling alone is one of the terrible things about troubles. When a child spends 3 days out of the past month out of the hospital, it is easy to feel like the only person experiencing the pressure. Sitting in the funeral home, answering the questions for an obituary while trying to figure out what just happened is a very isolating experience. The numbness of trauma makes a person feel alone.

Mary and Martha each mentioned to Jesus their need for his presence when Lazarus was dying. *If only you had been here, this would not have happened.* A very natural response.

A card, a call, a prayer, a note is a reminder not only of your presence but of your awareness of the pain, the fear, and the loss. Even those who experience the interruption of a hospital mourn the loss of "normal". Too often, we allow our knowledge that we can't "fix" it to make us think we are powerless.

Remember the 23rd Psalm, *Even though I walk through the Valley of the Shadow of Death, you are with me.* That is a statement about the importance of presence. We share in that role when we, as God's ambassadors, are present in crisis.

The friends I've mentioned here might never know you prayed for them. My mind is filled with many others who could be added to the list, a list of supportive prayer. But, with or without their knowledge you can be a part of a very important ministry. Let me encourage you to pray for those experiencing the feelings of being alone.

Let me ask you to join me in praying this week. My friend, who I mentioned praying with a few weeks ago, will bury his wife next Saturday. He would benefit from your prayers.

Another friend has a young son being treated for cancer in Arkansas. His wife stays in the hospital with the sick son while he keeps the other two children at home a few hours away. Yesterday, as they were driving back home, he and the older children were hit by a drunk driver destroying their car. Everyone was uninjured, but the frustration of the accident and having to replace the car is just "one more thing" in an overwhelming situation. It is the anniversary of the death of the sons of three of my friends, having died the same day a number of years apart. Such anniversaries are difficult, memories bittersweet and emotions very convoluted.

When people we love or care about are in pain, it is normal that we have concern. For me, praying has become a natural response to things I cannot repair. I might send a few dollars in an effort to address the financial burden of unexpected funerals, medical bills or financial setbacks, but I know my efforts don't "fix" things.
