

one of life's difficulties, praying people take the time for processing and reflection before God. It just doesn't sound right to ask God to hold your hat while you go beat some sense into your neighbor.

3. **Prayer increases the power to forgive.** Those who pray for those closest to them are more likely to act with grace and compassion toward them, even in times of stress.
4. **Prayer builds trust.** Those who report praying with a close friend also report an increase of intimacy with that friend. The ability to share the most difficult times in prayer creates a foundation for a strong viable relationship.
5. **Prayer reduces stress.** This portion is true only if your prayers are "other" focused. Those who pray for "personal gain or wealth" did not report prayer being helpful with stress. There is, however, a correlation between a focus that moves outside of ourselves and a reduction of personal stress.

So, does this mean we should pray because some research teaches us that prayer might be helpful to us physically? Of course not.

It does indicate that healthy beneficial prayer is an exercise of the surrender of self and a focus that is outside ourselves. It shouldn't be a surprise. Jesus reminded us that we forgive, as our Father in heaven has forgiven us. The focus of healthy prayer is transcendent. It is the exercise that allows a movement outside of selfishness and directs us toward a God-like mindset.

Those who know me know that I am a big advocate of praying. I enjoy a rich prayer discipline that shapes my day, shapes me, and opens me to a consciousness of God and my place before him.

Lots of people pray. A Pew Research poll in 2013 found that half of Americans report praying daily and 75% believe that daily prayer is an important part of life.

I am surprised by the inadvertent consequences of prayer. There is research that supports some tangible, measurable benefits of prayer.

1. **Prayer helps with self-control.** Those who regularly pray are more self-regulated, less likely to have outbursts and impulsive behaviors. Self-control is like a muscle, the more you exercise it, the stronger it becomes. It stands to reason then that those who make a practice of stopping to pray before difficult choices are less likely during stressful times to act in rash manner.
2. **Praying reduces aggression.** That is right, praying folks are nicer folks. Rather than having a purely emotive response to
