between BC and AD, then he would have been 37-38 in the spring of 33 AD. It isn't a doctrinal thing, just something I find interesting.

I've often heard that the crowds who worshipped Jesus at his triumphal entry into Jerusalem just a few days later cried for his crucifixion before Pilate. In reality, they were likely very different groups of people with different points of view.

Those who welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem were the pilgrims from Galilee, along with John's disciples. They were shouting "Hosanna" because of their idea of a Jewish king overthrowing the Romans. Those who were shouting for the crucifixion of Jesus before Pilate were Jewish residents of Jerusalem, stirred up by their religious leaders because they believe Jesus was guilty of blasphemy.

Again, not a big thing, but it doesn't demonstrate the fickle nature of man as much as it demonstrates what happens when people act from a lack of understanding. The Galilean Jews were celebrating what they hoped for a restoration of the Jewish nation to freedom. The Jerusalem Jews were reacting to lies fed to them by their misguided leaders. In both cases, ignorance was the root issue, not fickle behavior.

We know that he began his public ministry when he was about 30 years of age (Luke 3:23) and that there were four Passovers in that time.
