So amid the bumps or valleys in life, as God's people we still sing a song that points to him. Consider how others have handled this in Scripture.

David speaks of "walking on level ground", things in his life are not in upheaval at this time. His reaction is to ask God to examine him, to see that he walks in the light of his truth (Psalm 26).

In times of discord his focus is in the same direction. Consider Psalm 27, The Lord is my light and my salvation. Who is there to fear? The Lord is my life's fortress. Who is there to be afraid of?

In times of victory the movement remains toward God, acknowledging his care and action on our behalf. Consider the Psalmist once more in Psalm 20, He will give you your heart's desire and carry out all your plans... We will wave our flags in the name of our God.

Where belonging to God means belonging to each other

So, in any and all seasons of life, as the children of the Most High, we acknowledge him in all of our ways. Praise him, mention him, point to him in your day to day moments.
