Sabbath, from the ground which was like a hoarfrost, and was pounded into cakes with a honey like taste.

That may not sound too bad, but in high school I worked in a donut shop. You may not think you can get tired of donuts, but you can. For many years after that, just the taste of a glaze on a donut made me lose my appetite.

God provided food for Israel during their time in the desert, not a variety but enough. They knew what the next meal consisted of, in every house, every day.

The unusual thing about manna is that if you harvested too much, it would be ruined by the next day (except for the food harvested before the Sabbath which would last two days). God's provision wasn't to be hoarded, but used in the manner he described, for the purpose he had intended. It was always there, ready to be gathered, just in time for the need.

I wonder if there isn't a lesson for us there. When I hear the preachers on TV speak of what God is going to do in their listener's lives, it sounds like abundance, surplus, and grandeur. Manna wasn't that way. It was adequate, sufficient, and timely.
