seldom heard is a powerful opportunity. Paul, while in prison with an opportunity to speak of God in a hostile environment, requests prayers and offers advice to the Christians he writes in Colossians 4.

Be wise in the way you act toward those who are outside the Christian faith. Make the most of your opportunities. Everything you say should be kind and well thought out so what you know how to answer everyone.

Wise words for all of us. We have to give consideration to how we address difficult topics. We need to restudy how Jesus dealt with potentially conflictual encounters during his ministry. The woman at the well in John 4 acknowledges that Jesus was breaking some cultural taboos in speaking with her. When being "set up" in John 8 by those who brought the "woman taken in adultery", Jesus shows great compassion toward her while speaking words that cause introspection in the rock throwers. The insensitivity of the disciples toward the man born blind in John 9, more interested in a theological point about origins of sin than the plight of the man before them, makes me rejoice at the words and actions of Jesus.

There are important lessons there for us.
