It is an equalizer for us all, and no matter how well we eat, exercise, and reduce stress... death finally comes.

Paul describes death as "the last enemy to be put down." But in saying so, he is reminding us of the assurance of our resurrection. We, those who trust in the resurrection of Jesus, are confident that even death is a transient experience.

It is true however, that while in this world, we see death as the enemy. If you bury loved ones; parents, siblings, or children, the bitterness of the experience reminds us that this life is, as Scripture tells us, but a vapor... here momentarily, then vanishing into the void.

Few experiences can cause such an awareness of the fragile nature of this world and the instability that surrounds us. Plans, dreams and hopes are instantly adjusted, put aside or fade away as the truth of death appears. It requires great faith to say with Paul, *O Death where is your sting*? The losses in the intensity of the moments surrounding death cause us to feel all too acutely the sharpness of the pang.

As our health declines, or our maladies increase, we can begin to look forward to that better place, the renewed heavens and renewed earth where no more sorrows appear. We can learn to long for a better day. Until the return of the Christ, we see it only in anticipation, through a clouded veil.
