mingling with all of the other appeals for help, straining trying to hear where Jesus was so they could project their cries in the proper direction, it would not have been simple.

After the crowd dispersed as Jesus entered a house, disappearing from sight, the blind men stumble onto the door.

Many lessons can be drawn from this story, and I've considered some of them here before. Today I want to contemplate another question, perhaps one of the most important ones.

Is it possible that the reason that we don't bring more before God in prayer is because we don't believe that he can do anything? The blind men, with a sense of urgency and determination, doggedly followed Jesus until they caught up. There was something that they believed only he could change. They wanted it. Where belonging to God means belonging to each other

What have you taken before God with such passion? This is no "Now I lay me down to sleep" kind of conversation. These are the words that arise from despair and hopelessness. Your prayers, do you believe?
