the same way, that we will achieve the same results. For example, if early believers emphasized repentance, or baptism, or the Supper, we believe that we should emphasize those same topics. Our participation in the events might not be for the same reason, or even in the same manner, as the early followers.

While it may superficially appear to be doing the same thing, when we begin to explore Scripture, we have to remember that there is also the impact of a spiritual world on these things. Somewhere we must leave room for the "mystery of God" in the stories of Scripture.

It is a danger to believe that we can so understand the mind of God that we can no longer be surprised. We can't think that God is limited to what he has done historically, in seeing what God might do in future times. That is not to say that God is inconsistent, but to leave the room for God to act in a manner we have never seen, but is still a part of who he is.

Do we follow what others have done before us, of course? But never read Scripture as a textbook of facts to be fully comprehended and achieved.

In a discussion I had this past week, we were speaking about how we come to know and experience God. As you would agree, God both reveals himself in our natural world through the things he has created, and through the specifics of Scripture as he has recorded through the Holy Spirit in the various accounts of his interaction with man.

How we process that information is greatly influenced by the hearers. For example, American religious groups influenced by the Age of Enlightenment, tend to be more analytical in their approach. Roger Bacon (lived and died during the 1200s) is credited with bringing Europe out of the Dark Ages through an approach to life called inductive reasoning. This developed into the scientific method, where the idea of being able to replicate earlier processes was emphasized.

In science, we mix compounds in the same portions and in the same manner confident that we can reproduce what we've done before.

In Bible study, we examine what early Christians did believing if we do the same thing, in
