come, as it were, the functioning body of Jesus, walking among our peers and living out a life in tribute to him. It modifies our behavior in the most basic of all ways.

Paul describes this in the phrase, 'For me to live is Christ, and to die is gain... For it is no longer I who lives, but it is Christ living through me.'

It is a shallow view of this commission to attempt to only avoid sin. A Christ-like life is not simply avoiding sin, it is the active pursuit of righteousness, goodness, and blessing others. It is walking through the streets of one's community with an eye watchful of a place to bless. It is hearing the cries of the bitter and offering sweetness. It is sensing the plaintiff needs of the ignored and offering attention and value. It is recognizing the image of God in the most fallen of mankind and offering respect, concern, and attention.

We have in our blessings from God, perhaps the most fulfilling of all that could be offered. We live to bless others as Christ has blessed us. We become a conduit of the blessings of God on all of mankind. Our task, as God's child, is to be like him. We are to see the world as God sees it, not as an expanse, but each individual having the spark of God within them. We bless because we have been blessed.
