Matthew also describes Jesus as a new beginning.

"An account of the genesis (the genealogy, the beginnings) of Jesus, the Messiah." The word in the plural means origins or generations and is used often in the book of Genesis to introduce genealogies and narrative or to conclude them. It is a way to indicate divisions of the story.

Matthew's introduction is designed to register for the reader, to have a familiar ring, connecting to the book of Genesis. Jesus marks a new beginning, a new creation. Comparing it to John's opening chapter in the saga of Jesus has that same kind of ring to it.

This is how he fits in the overall story of God. He is the good news of God's promise, a fulfillment of the dreams and promises of God.

Jesus promises this same blessing to each of us. A transition to a new beginning, a fresh start. Each of us has a part in this story through him.

Matthew is very deliberate in his recording of the story of Jesus. He begins with the genealogy. He divides Old Testament history into 3 distinct times.

- 1) Foundation of the world to the establishment of the monarchy under David
- 2) From David to the destruction of the monarchy with the Babylonian Captivity
- 3) From the Babylonian Captivity to the coming of the Messiah to restore the monarchy of David

In addition to the nice sequential breakdown of the Old Testament into selections that help with the memorization necessary for the oral traditions to be passed down, there is another unspoken statement. Jesus is the end. This is the final act of the covenant that God has with his people.

The promises are being fulfilled in this God child revealed in the story. The story has run its completed course, now we move to the goal and climax in describing the events that culminate with the resurrection.


