Mother Mary

Protestants have always been a bit uncomfortable talking about Mary the mother of Jesus. Catholics and the Orthodox have developed elaborate "Mariologies" and venerate her next to God, even calling her the "Theotokos" (God-bearer). It is even taught that Mary was without sin! (A statement never supported in Scripture.) In response, we tend to shy away from talking about Mary except, perhaps, at Christmas, or we may mention the time she and Joseph lost the boy Jesus in the Temple (Luke 2:41 ff.), and that is a shame. Mary was a remarkable woman and a fitting example for us to study on Mother's Day.

Jesus loved his mother, and in no other Scripture, do we see Mary acting more like the mother of a grown-up child than John chapter two. Jesus and Mary have been invited to a wedding. A horrible faux pas has occurred. The young couple ran out of celebratory wine. (Today that would be like running out of wedding cake.) Mary turns to her son and points out the predicament. Up to this point, Jesus hadn't performed any miracles, and it is doubtful that she was expecting Jesus to do what he did. Mary just knew Jesus was caring and resourceful, and surely such a fine son could fix things. Now we

know the rest of the story. Jesus not only saved the day, but John reports:

> This, the first of his miraculous signs, Jesus performed at Cana in Galilee. He thus revealed his glory, and his disciples put their faith in him (John 2:11)

Unfortunately, shortly after this, the family of Jesus stopped following him. They loved Jesus, and they believed he was the best big brother a sibling could ever have, but they just couldn't believe Jesus was the Christ. If we think about it, we can understand their feelings, but how heartbreaking it must have been for them all!

Still, Mary was there at the foot of the cross, and she watched her baby boy die (John 19:25-27). Through a veil of tears, Mary must have remembered Simeon's prophecy: "And a sword will pierce your own soul too" (Luke 2:34). No mother should see her children taken away before her!

But the story doesn't end there. It very well may be that Jesus made a special resurrection appearance to his mother that is not recorded (after all, he appeared to his brother James, 1 Corinthians 15:7). What is recorded is, just a short time later, Mary and her children were gathered in an upper room with the faithful disciples. They were there when the Holy Spirit came, and the Christian Age began (Acts 1:14).

You see, moms never stop believing in their children, and that's why I love mine so. I miss you, mom.
