This we know: The Church in Ephesus was extremely busy! Priscilla and Aquila prepared the way for the Apostle Paul. Apollos preached there as did Timothy. The first Christian school was in Ephesus (Acts 19:9). From this busy congregation, missionaries established churches all over Asia. It was a busy place, and the Apostle John was worried about them.

How would we feel if the last surviving apostle was a member of our congregation? Likewise, we probably would have certain expectations of how an apostle should act and dress, wouldn't we? But what if it seemed like the apostle was losing his mind in his old age? A report was circulating John had a pet partridge, a bird much like a chicken. This wasn't dig-

nified! Something had to be done. Something had to be said, and so a delegation was appointed to speak to the old man.

They arrived at John's house about dinner time and saw with their own eyes: the story was true. John was not only holding the bird; he was feeding it scraps from his plate! The men began to chide John gently and explained how he must maintain a certain dignity as the last surviving apostle. It was unseemly for him to act like a little child!

The Apostle John looked up, smiled, and fixed his gaze on each one of the busy men. He chuckled and made his point: "You can't keep the bow strung all the time." Then he returned to his little bird.
