### Coco & Tish Big News from Oaxaca

We pray all are healthy and beginning to return to post-COVID normal, whatever that might be in your area! Here in Mexico our allowed activities rely on a stoplight system: Red-stay home, Orange-limited activities, Yellow-with caution, Green-FREEDOM (with masks). This month in Oaxaca we achieved Green status, which the Lord perfectly provided just in time for a visit from my mom and Emily's return home for the summer! We were able to go out more often than normal and enjoy a bit of "fresh" air.

COVID-19 affected ministry in so many ways that I imagine are similar to what everyone else has experienced. It also gave us time to reflect on what priorities we have in our lives and readjust activities accordingly. If you follow us on Facebook (we really hope you do!) today, at the half year mark of 2021, we will be announcing a new family ministry page (we are tweaking the logo) that we hope will help provide ministry updates and better our communication. (We are also asking that if you read this newsletter, you would pop us a quick message, just to let us know that our email list is updated.)

tThe congregation, during this time, has been persevering and we have had 4 baptisms in these 6 months. The church has a strong group of men for leadership who are ready to teach and take on areas that Jorge has been helping. The congregation now has their own land and small building and are able to provide some economical support for Jorge's Co-leader, Toño. We are satisfied that we have been able to be part of the congregation and participate through preaching, teaching, small groups, Zoom classes, etc... and are blessed to see how they have grown NOT because of our efforts, but through Christ who is at work in them and us!

So, what is the Big News from Oaxaca? We have reached a point in our ministry with the San Pedro congregation where we feel able to venture out and pursue new fields for kingdom growth. For several years I (Latisha) have had a heart calling to reach the women and babies in lower income areas. A wise brother once mentioned to us, "The only way to reach them, is to go to them. They can't afford to come to the City." Right before the Pandemic hit, I was able to travel to a mountain region where a fellow midwife lives and see first-hand the need of quality maternity care for the women in the surrounding villages. We have been praying since then and investigating the possibility of opening a birth center much like Casa Compasiva in a strategic larger town called Tlaxiaco. It is a town 3 1/2 hours from the capital where we are now, and the pregnant women from all surrounding villages are required to travel in labor or at 38 weeks pregnancy to that city of Tlaxiaco where they are at mercy of the crowded government hospital. These hospitals are famous for women being turned away and birthing in the toilets or out on the lawn. overuse of cesarean sections to move women through faster, and placing IUDs (intrauterine device birth control)without consent/knowledge of the women. The mission would be to provide quality maternal care based on communication and compassion for the women and families in the region and at the same time provide spiritual support for them with the goal of presenting Christ in a simple and practical way. With God's grace the Gospel will be spread to these families and the Kingdom will continue to grow.

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or was it because God didn't want anything to come between him and Moses? I've often wondered if it had been me, would I have taken my shoes off and felt the sand between my toes?

Do you feel close to God, or is something coming between you and intimate fellowship with him? I once saw a sign in front of the church that warned: "If you are letting a hypocrite come between you and God – he's closer to God than you are!"

What is the spiritual sand that is keeping you from enjoying fellowship with the Lord? Are you afraid of change? Is there something in your life – work or an "entangling sin" (Hebrews 12:10)? Are you too busy to stop and feel the warm sand of fellowship between your toes? Are you worried about getting too close to someone, and you'd rather keep those Christians at arm's length?
