

People" addict! (That's a television show about hunting alligators in the swamps of Louisiana where the main characters are Cajuns who race around in boats shouting, "Choot'em! Choot'em!")

It was an interesting experience. For example, people shouted from across the house, "John, do you want anything?" That's nice, but I couldn't yell back, "I'd love a Fudgsicle!" Or, it was natural when I whispered; people would whisper back to me like we're keeping some grand secret.

It's a great challenge for a preacher to lose his voice! Imagine what it would be like if suddenly all the preachers lost their voices? Before you add that to your prayer list, a friend of mine observed. "Well, they could still send text messages!" That may be, but an unspoken dread most ministers share is a kind of discouragement that causes us to wonder if we are doing any good? Is anyone really listening to what we have to say? Are we relevant or just tolerated?

In Tim Hansel's wonderful book, *Holy Sweat*, he shared this story about the devil having a garage sale:

He was selling quite a few tools he had used over the centuries. Some were barely used, others a little worn. But one was almost totally worn out. Some bargain-hunting soul picked up the worn-out tool and asked, "What is this?"

The devil replied, "Ooooh, that's been my favorite tool from the beginning. When nothing else works, I always use that." And he laughed devilishly.

The bargain hunter looked closer and saw, scratched on the tool's side, the word "Discouragement."

The challenge for preachers is two-fold. The first is not to give up but to continue to speak out. Noah preached for over 100 years, and no one except his own family listened to what he had to say, vet he is called a man of God. The second challenge is the far more critical imperative. The famine isn't of preachers but of "hearing the words of the Lord." It isn't enough to just speak. We must be sure of our message! Now excuse me while I gargle again and try to find my voice for today's sermon.
