Politics #1 of 7:

As we celebrated the 249th birthday of our country this week, the legislature finished one of the largest, and maybe most impactful bills in our country's history. No one truly knows what impact (both positive and negative that this bill is going to have), but most Americans have an opinion on the matter. Having an opinion on political matters is not against the Bible's teachings, but how Christians respond should be guided by the Bible's teachings and the movement of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

For the next several weeks, we will dive into the topic of Christianity and politics in our bulletin articles. Politics get us all worked up, but we should be focused on Godly things and not earthly things when we try to make an impact in our communities.

I believe this topic is a timely, critical discipleship issue in the church for several reasons: politics is on your mind and constantly in your face (billboards, social media, news, celebrities, corporations, and retail establishments are all overly politicized), Christians are being driven to fear and divisiveness (both against biblical principles), relationships are being broken over political opinions, the Church's witness is at risk due to unhealthy Christian responses, this process requires wisdom and discernment which can only come from God, and God desires unity from his followers.

Christians usually (but not always) take two approaches to politics. #1 – Put your head in the sand and hope it will go away. #2 – Assume God is on your side and be partisan – this leads us to think that everything our party does is blessed by God. Both of these approaches are faulty. Politics and issues in our community are not going away, and God does not support one party over another. We must develop a kingdom-first approach to earthly politics and we will look at how to do that in the coming weeks.
